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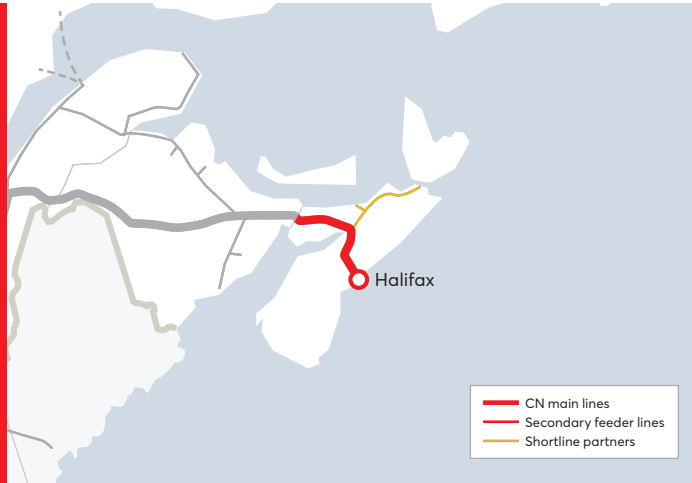

Our operations support more than 780 jobs in the province and adds \$179M to Nova Scotia's GDP*

Nova Scotia is home to the Port of Halifax, where CN handles all rail served containers imported and exported through the marine facility. Halifax Regional Municipality, home to more than 300 CN employees, also hosts Autoport in Eastern Passage, where automotive vehicles imported from overseas enter North America for distribution across the continent. One of our intermodal terminals is also located in Halifax.

Network Investments

CN's Atlantic operations showed excellent efficiency in 2025, and key projects in 2026 will further improve capacity and fluidity in Nova Scotia, including a rail expansion at the Port of Halifax's South End Terminal and upgrades to CN's Pace Yard.

This work, in addition to the ongoing integration of the CBNS short line into CN's tri-coastal network ensure the region is poised to accommodate new growth, power Nova Scotia's economy and facilitate new trading relationships across the Atlantic.

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$235 million to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Nova Scotia and to support our supply chain partners. A key project is the Tower Road reconstruction project in Halifax, which started in 2025 and will finish in 2026. The program also focused on upgrades to bridges and Autoport, the replacement of rail and ties, plus maintenance of crossings, culverts, signal systems, and other track infrastructure.

As part of the CN EcoConnexions - from the Ground Up program, CN was proud to fund the planting of 50 large trees across four public parks in the Halifax Regional Municipality, including at Baker Drive Community Park in Dartmouth, N.S.

Community Investments

In 2025, CN contributed to many Nova Scotia-based organizations, including:

SKILLS CANADA CN helped advance initiatives that engage youth and their communities in skilled trades and technology careers, helping build awareness and pathways into in-demand industries.

ALICE HOUSE Support from CN helped provide food security for survivors of domestic violence on their journey toward independence, alongside safe housing, counselling, and support services for women and their children.

THE DISCOVERY CENTRE CN partnered with the Discovery Centre to help develop and deliver a railroad-themed Little Learners program at the CN Toddler Port space, creating a fun and engaging way for young children to learn about rail safety.

WE'KOPEKWITH COMPETITION POW WOW CN was proud to support the Millbrook First Nation community and its annual Pow Wow, one of the largest cultural gatherings in Nova Scotia, bringing together over 1,000 participants to celebrate Indigenous traditions and community.

ONE PORT CITY DAY As presenting sponsor of the Port of Halifax's One Port City Day, CN again helped bring together community members, industry partners, and visitors through rides on Little Obie, tours, exhibits, and family activities celebrating the people and organizations that make the port city thrive.

LOVE NOVA SCOTIA CN contributed to the inaugural gala for Love Nova Scotia, an organization that empowers youth from diverse backgrounds to realize their potential and build a positive future through mentorship and community programming.
