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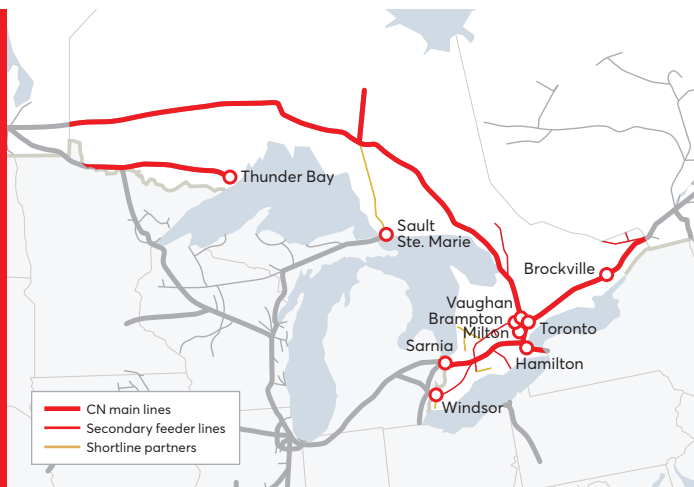

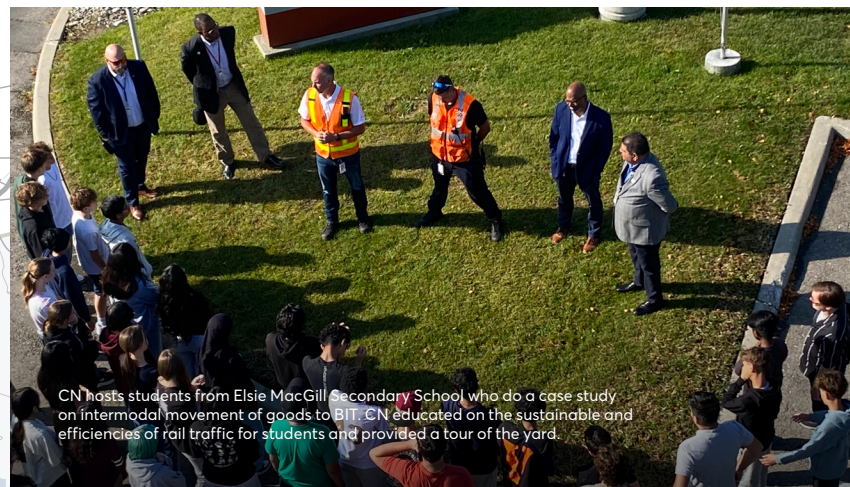
Our operations support over 12,900 jobs in the province and add \$2.6B to Ontario's GDP*

Large volumes of traffic are handled in Ontario, much of it at MacMillan Yard — CN's largest rail classification facility and our only hump yard in Eastern Canada. Mac Yard also has railcar and locomotive repair shops. Intermodal containers are handled at CN's biggest terminal in Brampton as well as another nearby. The Toronto area, which is home to over 3,000 CN railroaders, also boasts a distribution facility for automobiles, one for forest products, two for metals, a logistics park, and two CargoFlo® bulk handling facilities. In addition, CN has a forest products distribution centre in Brockville and one for autos in Windsor.

Network Investments

CN remains committed to the Milton Logistics Hub, a critically needed infrastructure project that will strengthen Ontario's and Canada's supply chains and improve access to global markets. The project was subject to Canada's most extensive environmental review process. Once complete, it will be one of the most advanced and environmentally friendly intermodal facilities worldwide.

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$4.3 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Ontario and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the transformation of our intermodal operations. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

Community Investments

In 2025, CN contributed to many Ontario-based organizations, including:

RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES AWARENESS INITIATIVE (RRAI) CN supported the Rights and Responsibilities Awareness Initiative, which empowers marginalized communities through multilingual education on legal, financial, and social rights, improving access to critical information and resources.

CREDIT VALLEY CONSERVATION (CVC) CN partnered with Credit Valley Conservation, a community-based environmental organization dedicated to protecting, restoring, and managing the natural resources of the Credit River watershed.

FOOD BANKS CANADA – NATIONAL FOOD SHARING SYSTEM Support from CN helped strengthen Food Banks Canada's National Food Sharing System, a vital logistics network that helps secure and distribute large-scale food donations to more than 5,500 hunger-relief organizations across the country.

HOCKEY HELPS THE HOMELESS As a Premier National Partner, CN supported a national initiative to raise awareness of and funds for programs addressing homelessness in Canada.

PATHWAYS TO EDUCATION CN supported Pathways to Education, a national charity helping youth in low-income communities overcome barriers, graduate from high school, and build a strong foundation for future success.

SHELTER MOVERS CN was proud to support Shelter Movers, a volunteer-powered charity that provides free moving and storage services to individuals and families fleeing abuse.

STARLIGHT CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION CANADA Through its community investment efforts, CN supported Starlight Children's Foundation Canada in distributing Indigenous pediatric hospital kits, providing culturally meaningful comfort and care for Indigenous pediatric patients and their families across Canada.

LET'S TALK SCIENCE CN collaborated with Let's Talk Science, an organization preparing youth for future careers and citizenship through STEM education, including partnerships to develop professional learning opportunities for Indigenous educators.

CN CYCLE FOR CHEO – CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF EASTERN ONTARIO As title sponsor, CN helped support life-saving pediatric oncology research and treatment at the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario, helping young patients experience fewer long-term effects from treatment and return to being kids.
